

Asia e University produces yet another batch of high-calibre graduates

KUALA LUMPUR: Asia e University (AeU: <http://www.aeu.edu.my/>) has produced yet another dynamic workforce as 2,927 of its graduates earned their scrolls at the fifth graduation ceremony, held at the Putra World Trade Centre, Kuala Lumpur.

The graduating batch comes from a total of 78 academic and executive programmes.

A total of 535 international students graduated in this convocation, including those from Bahrain, Hong Kong, Indonesia, India, Iran, Kenya, UK, Maldives, New Zealand, Pakistan,

Somalia, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Vietnam and Zimbabwe.

This signifies that AeU is making inroads into the international arena.

AeU is currently offering programmes in countries like India, Iran, Iraq, Sri Lanka, Vietnam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Bahrain, China, Hong Kong, Pakistan, Bangladesh, the Middle Eastern region, Mauritius, Maldives, Nigeria, Ghana, Somalia, Taiwan, Thailand, New Zealand, Denmark and UK.

The university has so far enrolled nearly 4,000 international students from 64 countries, about 25 per cent of the total enrolment, many of whom are postgraduate students.

The graduation batch also includes 521 graduates from the Program Pensiswazahan Guru (PPG), the second batch of its kind for AeU.

PPG is a programme sanctioned by the Ministry of Education.

These graduates are teachers who have successfully completed their Bachelor of Education (TESL) and Bachelor of Education (Teaching Malay Language in Primary School) with Honours.

Liew Chee Foh (Master of Education with a Specialization in Educational Assessment) clinched the Chairman's Award while Hasmah Jamin (Bachelor of Education (Teaching Malay Language in Primary School) with Honours) won the President's Award.
