She said this was in line with the adult-learning theory of Malcom Knowles, where the adult learner would learn what he needed using his prior knowledge and experience.

"I also went for a research clinic to consult my lecturer for a research proposal."

Than said she also had course mates from different backgrounds, including music, information technology, military, business and law.

"AeU provided me with adequate online resources which are very useful for me throughout my studies. As I can do my research online, I do not have to go to the library frequently."
