Admission for the BDCM

programme can be through the conventional entry path or open entry paths. For normal entry path, candidates should have an A-Levels/ STPM/diploma or equivalent.

Through the open entry path, AeU provides a flexible admission system for part-time study mode based on Recognition for Prior Learning (RPL) concept, where previous industry experiences and professional certifications are all given due credit value and carried some weightage.

Candidates must be at least 21 years old and possess minimum PMR/SRP/LCE or equivalent, with recognised working experience.

There are three intakes annually – January, May and September – and AeU will assist students to apply for PTPTN loans and EPF scheme.
